
Their expertise and generosity in sharing knowledge have greatly enriched the course and will undoubtedly benefit our students with their future endeavors in the insurance and financial sector.

Katrien Antonio was one of the scientific directors of the 35th International Summer School of the Swiss Association of Actuaries. During the week from June 3-7, Katrien together with prof. Michel Vellekoop, prof. Torsten Kleinow, dr. Frank van Berkum (pwc and UvA) and PhD student Jens Robben gave approx. 23 hours of training on the topic of 'modelling and quantifying mortality and longevity risk'. 85 participants from industry and academia, and from different parts of the world came together in Lausanne to enjoy the 35th edition of this summer school with a long and rich tradition.
